Pastor's Keyboard: "Discipleship: On the Clock!"

Dr. Benjamin E. Mays, in his poem, "God's Minute," writes: "I've only just a minute, Only sixty seconds in it. Forced upon me, can't refuse it, Didn't seek it, didn't choose it, But it's up to me to use it. I must suffer if I lose it, Give an account if I abuse it. Just a tiny little minute, But eternity is in it."

Time is a Gift of God for you! We are born into *Chronos* (biological time; chronological, calendar, & clock time) and born again into *Kairos* (holy opportune time). Discipleship allows us to measure our time. How well will we spend the time God gives us? Only time will tell!

Time flies. The clock is ticking! The wages of sin is death. There is no escaping our mortality. But *in Christ*, we live in the promise of immortality. The perishable will put on the imperishable. Death will be swallowed up in victory! Thanks be to God through our Lord Jesus Christ!—I Corinthians 15.

One of my favorite hymns "Rock of Age" contains these words: "Time, like an ever-rolling stream, Soon bears us all away; We fly forgotten, as a dream dies at the opening day." For everything there is a season



& a TIME for every matter under heaven. One year ends & another year begins; at the stroke of Midnight. We are clock and calendar people. Time is money. Lost time is never found again. Time! Free time, making time, killing time, hard time, and a whale of a time. Time doesn't always heal all wounds. We can't turn back the hands of time. When it comes to decision making, only time will tell.

Dorothy Bass, in her book, Receiving the Day, discussing Psalm 90, describes how this psalm brings together two kinds of time: i.e. Our short sigh & God's mountainous eternity." Our lives are so miniscule compared with the vast perspective of God; yet somehow, each of our tiny

little lives is sacred and full and unique. Our saving Faith in Jesus embraces this beautiful paradox: Human life is infinitesimal and epic at the exact same time. In other words, *Chronos* is redeemed by *Kairos*.

St. Paul says, "Redeem the Time!"—Ephesians 5:16. Paul is talking about Kairos time! By the grace of God, we are on the clock with Christ! David Jeremiah writes, "Saving us is the greatest and most concrete demonstration of God's love, the definitive display of His grace throughout time and eternity." Ole Hallesby writes, "You can use your time to no better advantage than to pray whenever you have a moment, either alone, or with others, while at work, at rest, or walking down the street! Anywhere!"

In January of 2016, Rori Blakeney wrote, "What is Kairos Time?" He quoted Mays' poem (God's Minute) & added, "In

College, it was impressed upon me the importance of time, and how we are gifted with it. ... Our time really does count. More importantly, understanding God's time is key. God's time is often referred to as "Kairos time." Greek in its origin, "Kairos time" reminds us that our lives are filled with God moments. This time is all about the movement of God in our lives. These God moments are often characterized as coincidence or serendipity. Yet, if we would listen to the Spirit, we would discover that these moments are acts of divinity." They are holy, divinely given, opportune moments well spent in meditation & prayer!

Blakeney continues, "Kairos time is designed to help us fulfill our God given purpose in life! Unlike Kairos time, Chronos time can be viewed as ordinary time. It is chronological or sequential time. Chronos time is the clock passing from one minute to the next. While Chronos time is important and a gift, we should seek to live in Kairos time. So, the next time you hear the question, 'What time is it' consider these questions as you determine your answer: Is God speaking to you about a particular issue; a particular time/season in your life; a particular issue in the life of the faith community; or a particular time/season in the life of the faith community?" Good advice for the Time Being ... a gift from God! Gordon C. Stewart, in "Bemused by Time", writes, "Time and place are gifts of creaturely existence, boundaries within which we live our lives appreciatively or scornfully in the midst of the Eternal (THE LORD). Time and place are set within the larger Mystery – the Mystery that makes us mortals tremble and fascinates us at the same time, the Mystery of the Eternal without which we are nothing. Time and place – birth, finite life, death – exist within the Mystery of that which does not die: Eternity." St. Paul writes, "Behold! I tell you a mystery. We shall not all sleep, but we shall all be changed, in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, and the dead will be raised imperishable, and we shall be changed."

We are on the Clock. **Times up!** The buzzer goes off. <u>Now what</u>? Waste not; want not. The trumpet sounds. <u>Then what</u>? Chronos time is redeemed by Kairos time. May our time on earth be well spent for the glory of God! Redeemed by Jesus, more time awaits us; eternal time with the ONE who is Eternal; Eternal Life and Eternity for you & for me! "<u>God's Minute</u>: Just a tiny little minute, But eternity is in it." Time is a precious. Time is a treasure. Time must be used wisely. What difference will your God-given time make? "There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens"—Ecclesiastes 3. There is nothing better than spending TIME (*Chronos & Kairos*) with Jesus!

This will allow us to use the larger building SO MUCH MORE! One new gift of \$5,000 has already been received for this purpose.
